


English

Children will read the story 'The Mousehole Cat' and use this as inspiration to create their own poem and story. They will have opportunities to write in different styles and learn what a legend is.




Maths

Children will secure their knowledge in addition and subtraction. They will explore and learn the column method with the concept of exchanging. They will also solve a range of addition and subtraction problems.

The children will then move onto multiplication and consolidate their learning by making equal groups, using arrays, sharing, and grouping. They will use all of these concepts to secure their knowledge in the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

Science

Children will study forces and magnets. They will compare how things move on different surfaces.



They will observe how magnets attract or repel each other and how they attract some materials and not others. They will learn to describe magnets as having 2 poles and predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing.

History

Children will continue to learn about chronology by placing key historical world events on a timeline. Children will learn about crime and punishment and study this concept over different historical periods of time:

- Anglo-Saxons
- Tudors
- Victorian
- Modern day Britain

Music

This half term the children will continue to take part in Ukulele lessons weekly. They will learn basic notes and how to play simple songs.



ICT

Children will explore how ICT can affect our health, well-being, and lifestyle. They will start to explain why spending too much time using technology can sometimes have a negative impact on us and give some examples of activities where it is easy to spend a lot of time engaged.

The children will also learn about Augmented reality and Virtual reality. They will create their own digital 360 image and explore it in virtual reality. They will also create their own images and bring it into their surroundings through augmented reality.

PE

The children will be working on performing dances using a range of movement patterns. Each week they will get the opportunity to learn dance steps associated with different styles of dance and choreograph a sequence of steps together.

They will compare their performances with previous ones and demonstrate improvement to achieve their personal best.



Art and Design

The children will study Hans Holbein (younger) and take inspiration from him to first sketch and then paint a picture.

This will involve learning and practising the following skills:

- Draw lines of different sizes and thicknesses
- Colour neatly, following the lines
- Show pattern and texture by adding dots and lines
- Show different tones by using coloured pencils

Design and Technology (Textiles)

The children will plan, design, and make a neckerchief by joining textiles with the appropriate stitching.



MFL

Children will continue to learn Spanish on a weekly basis. Children will read stories and sing songs to embed learning.

This half term they will finish learning the phonics sounds for the Spanish alphabet.

PSHE

Children will follow the Jigsaw Curriculum for PSHE. In this half term the children will work on the unit 'Celebrating Differences'. This will involve themes such as understanding that everybody's family is different and important to them and that sometimes difference and conflicts happen among family members. They will learn how to help if someone is being bullied.

Further to this, they will learn how to give and receive compliments.

RE

Children will learn about many world religions during their time at school. In this half term the children will aim to answer the question: Why is the Bible important for Christians today?
